Chester-Blandford State Forest Trails, Chester

Old roads and blazed off-road trails criss cross the 2,300-acre Chester-Blandford State Forest. The one-mile Sanderson Brook Falls Trail leads to the beautiful 60 foot cascade. The H. Newman Marsh Memorial Trail features a challenging, but rewarding, climb to the top of Observation Hill, with views spanning the wild and scenic Westfield River valley. There is a Boulder Park Universal Access interpretive trail.

Location: South side of Route 20 in Chester

Parking: Two designated parking lots along Route 20

Trail Type: Marked off-road, unpaved road, universally accessible.

Length/Difficulty: Length varies; Easy to strenuous

Permitted Uses: Hiking, mountain biking, camping (restrictions), horseback riding, cross-country skiing,

snowmobiling.

Facilities: Restrooms located by campground. Pavilion at start of interpretative trail.
