Fitzgerald Lake Conservation Area, Northampton

The 625-acre Fitzgerald Lake Conservation Area contains boardwalks and asphalt trails that are universally accessible. Most of the approximately 4 miles of trails are off-road blazed walking trails. Trails border wetlands, cross streams, and run along Fitzgerald Lake offering opportunities to view wildlife.

Location:	From exit 19 of 1-91 take Damon Road to Bridge St., turn right on Mountain Rd. and right on North Farms Rd. A second access is off Cooke Avenue.
Trail Type:	Paved and unpaved sections of marked walking trail
Length/Difficulty:	4 miles (approx.); Easy to moderate
Permitted Uses:	Hiking, jogging, picnicking, and cross-country skiing; no motorized vehicles
Parking:	Entry and parking on North Farms Rd., at the Moose Lodge on Cooke Avenue, and on Marian St.
