Glendale Falls Trail, Middlefield

Glendale Falls is one of the longest waterfall runs in Massachusetts, dropping in steps more than 150 feet before joining the Middle Branch of the Westfield River.

Trustees of Reservations have developed a quarter-mile trail leads to the bottom of the falls and a 0.3 mile woods road leads south.

Location: From Route 143 west and follow for 4.2 miles. Turn left onto East River Rd. and follow for

5.6 miles. Turn right onto Clark Wright Rd. and proceed 0.4 miles to entrance

Trail Type: Marked off-road trails

Length/Difficulty: less than 1 mile, involving 2 trails; Moderate hiking, strenuous in places

Permitted Uses: Hiking, bird watching, and picnicking; no motorized vehicles

Parking: Designated parking for up to 7 vehicles

Facilities: Picnic areas
