

South Hadley Trails

The Town of South Hadley offers three hiking trails, including:

- Bachelor Brook-Stony Brook Conservation Area consists of 284 acres ranging from upland forest to open grassland, wetland forested floodplain to farmland. Off Ferry Road.
- The Black-Stevens Conservation Area, on 62 acres, area has four trails, including the Black-Stevens Trail, the K&N Trail, the Lady Slipper Loop and the Border Trail. Off Newton Street or Lyman Street.
- Bynan Conservation Area consists of 162 acres of small ponds, pitch pine and oak forest. The woodland trails network provides access to diverse habitat and nature watching. Off east end of Lyman Terrace, the end of Bartlett St., or New Ludlow Rd.

Unpaved walking trails

Length/Difficulty:

1-2 miles; Easy to moderate

Permitted Uses:

Hiking, horseback riding, jogging, picnicking, and cross- country skiing.
